Itinerant Teachers – Music lessons in school time:

We are fortunate at Emmanuel to have some highly qualified and skilled Itinerant Music teachers and the programme is thriving! <u>Please contact Louise Morrison at the school office if you are interested in having your child enrolled in any of the following Music lessons:</u>

- Anne Robinson and her team from the Christchurch School of Music oversees the string programme and offers both <u>violin and cello</u> lessons. Many of our students are also playing in the Orchestras at CSM a huge opportunity! There are limited spaces available for a few more students to be involved in the string programme, lessons are in school time on a Wednesday. Music examinations are offered.
- Maree Par is our <u>flute, clarinet and saxophone</u> teacher. She also comes to us with years of experience behind her and her students are flourishing! She also has limited spaces for more students, lessons are on a Tuesday. Music examinations are offered.
- Adrian Dalton is our <u>trumpet and trombone</u> teacher, he is head of the Norwest Brass Band and students learning from Adrian also have the wonderful opportunity of joining his Brass Band! Lessons are on Tuesday morning before school.
- Daniel Hitchens is the creator of the Monster Music programme and he and his team offer <u>drums</u>, <u>guitar and ukulele</u> lessons. Students in this programme are often involved in performing in many of the amazing concerts that Daniel and his team organise! Drum lessons are in-school on Monday, Guitar/Uke lessons are in-school on Thursday.
- Haram Lee teaches **piano** and is in school on a Thursday and Friday. Haram is extremely patient and is an excellent teacher. Music examinations are offered.

I cannot emphasise enough the amazing Musical opportunities that students are privileged to receive at Emmanuel, these tutors are all highly qualified and many provide amazing performance opportunities for students outside of our Emmanuel School programme. Students also have ample opportunities to be fully involved in the school extra-curricular activities, many of which very few primary schools offer.

Extra – Curricular Groups at Emmanuel:

NOTE: If your child is learning an instrument, it is very beneficial to join a choir. This helps to train their ear so that they can pitch their notes more accurately on their instrument. Please encourage them to join either the Senior Choir or the Junior Choir.

- <u>Senior Choir</u> – Tuesday 8.15 – 8.45 all welcome. *Benefits = Learning to be comfortable with expressing themselves through singing. Working together in a supportive group situation, making friends, part singing.*

Training confident church song leaders.

- Junior Choir (Year 1 6) Friday 9.30 10.00, Year 5 and 6 extension group 10 10.40 (Starting in Term 2) Children wanting to be in junior choir must stay behind in the Hall after Assembly.
- School Orchestra Term 1: Tuesday 2 2.45, starting week 5. Unfortunately due to limited in-school time, Orchestra will be run on a Tuesday directly after school from 2:55 3.40. We are looking into the possibility of entering the Aurora Festival (5th- 7th September) with Maree Par and her Lincoln primary students to fill our gaps in trumpet, horn and clarinet players. For our students, this would be an incredible opportunity to perform, compete and be tutored by some of Christchurch's top

conductors. This will only be possible if we have enough students who are willing to commit for Term 2 and 3 to after school practices.

Orchestra would take a break after the competition, to re-commence in Term 4 in-school time with non-stressful Christmas programme! If you are interested in your child being involved in this, please email me as soon as possible so that I can see whether this competition is going to be feasible – we need to get our entry in quickly. Places are limited.

Carter takes the recorder group and all are welcome. Last year in all 3 groups we had students who auditioned and successfully secured solo spots, a huge honour and opportunity for our school!



The Lions Christchurch Schools' Music Festival – year 5 - 8 (22nd – 25th October) is an annual school choir event and this year more than 90 schools are participating. It is held in the Christchurch Town Hall for 4 nights. Due to limited space, we are only able to take 20 students in Year 5 – 8 to participate. In the first week of Term 3 we will be starting the

repertoire for this event. If you are keen for your child to be involved please encourage them to come to the

PLEASE NOTE: For years now we have had many of our talented students successfully audition and secure a spot in the Orchestra, Concert Band, Senior Rep Choir and Junior Rep Choir. This is a fantastic and very unique opportunity to play or sing beside some of Christchurch's top talent in the Primary School age group, however, it is also a big commitment of hours of practice, so please read it all carefully!

Classroom Music



At Emmanuel starting in Harakeke, your child will learn the basic elements of Music. Over the years they will learn Recorder, Ukulele, Xylophone, Keyboard (senior option) Bucket Drumming, Cup Rhythms, Singing and Composition using computer programmes. They will be involved in end of Term Performances, Easter and Christmas Services and Productions – gaining valuable skills in performing!
