Thank you for joining us on this exciting new journey. We look forward to growing closer as a community with each published issue.



Two New Laundromats Set to Open in Eltham

Eltham is soon to become even more accommodating with the opening of two new laundromats.

La Nuova Arrives in Eltham: located at the old TSB building, the setup includes various sizes of Primus washers and Huebsch dryers, all operational 24/7 and soon to be priced.

A third-generation family business with nearly 20 years in the laundromat sector and over 60 years in laundry and dry cleaning, La Nuova is a community staple.

Eltham has been on La Nuova's radar for years, but a site that would work has not been available. "When the opportunity to acquire the TSB building at an affordable price presented itself, we knew it was time to act. We aim to transform this space into a great asset for Eltham," Leyton Craig states. Future plans include demolishing the nearby old Pinkys building to make way for additional parking, enhancing accessibility for all patrons.

La Nuova aims to open its doors in mid-August, although final dates may adjust.

Wash Q - A Local Entrepreneur's Venture:

located in the town center, is nearing completion and aims to open in a month. The owners, who have deep roots in the region, "Eltham was my main shopping center growing up, and I have many fond memories here," says Tina Hardcastle, who, along with her husband, returned to New Zealand after spending 15 years abroad in Chile and Australia.

Their experience with crowded facilities in Hawera inspired them to open their first laundromat there last December, which has been successful. Encouraged by this success, they seized the opportunity to expand to Eltham. "We are aiming to have the cheapest prices with great customer service," Tina adds, underscoring their commitment to the community.

With the opening of these laundromats, Eltham gains not just enhanced laundry options, but also valuable additions to our local business community. We're excited to see how these new establishments will make daily chores easier and contribute positively to our community's vibrant life.


Seven Schools Reunion in Eltham Next February!

24/7 AED Now Available at TouchPoint Building

New Bins Being Delivered

Properties serviced by the Council's kerbside recycling and rubbish collection will start receiving their new bins. For Eltham and surrounds, the delivery will be **12 - 16 August**.

Properties will receive:

- One 140 litre red-lidded wheelie bin
- One 240 litre yellow-lidded wheelie bin
- One blue glass recycling crate
- One 23 litre food scraps bin

What you need to know:

- They will be delivered to your kerbside.
- Each bin has your address clearly labelled, so please bring them onto your property and store them somewhere safe until October.
